The Lord has yet to fill me in on why our ministries and Centenary are a good fit. We will find out in time. For now, it is like the Lord has dumped a box of jigsaw puzzle pieces on a table. Soon we will begin the process of assembling. Some will want to start by sorting all the pieces by color, others will want to find the edge pieces first. and, still others will grab a handful and simply try fitting similar pieces together.

There is no correct way to assemble a jigsaw puzzle. I believe if I was working on a 1,000-piece puzzle with a group of people, I would start by asking how everyone would like to proceed. Forming a consensus might be a little tricky, but if we are all in agreement that the goal is to complete the project, we will find a place to start and begin moving forward.

The image, which has been divided into 1,000 smaller pieces, will soon come into focus. I ask for patience, that as we begin to build together, we learn the best way to get the work accomplished. It's not only finishing the puzzle, it's also about building relationships as we work side by side.

Don't forget, whatever the image that has yet to be revealed is the work of God's hand, not ours. The way I read the scriptures, I see Jesus handing each disciple a handful of pieces and asking each to complete their assigned section. After completing our part, the Lord will take all those sections and assemble the finished masterpiece.

Often the Lord doesn't provide the box cover art, so we can see what we're building. God may want us to persevere, have patience and wait to see what the image is. We are asked to have faith in what we cannot see. Now is the time for building and trusting in the one who created the picture. I believe people can have great conversations and build strong friendships all while working on their own part of the puzzle. We may laugh or we may cry, we might even disagree a little, but God asks that we remain at the table working for the Kingdom.

I thank God for the opportunity to come to Jacksonville and begin working on a puzzle with the people of Centenary and the surrounding community.

I love jigsaw puzzles and I have my own way of working them. I am not coming to Jacksonville to train you on how to assemble the way I do. I want to know how you approach the challenge of seeing the unseen. How we go about this journey depends on whether we focus on our own purposes - - or God's.

The challenges we are sure to face together will never be without the guiding hand of our Creator. After all, sometimes God dumps out the puzzle pieces, turns them all upside down so only the gray is showing and invites us to begin. We stare at the task at hand and begin to think, "This is impossible!" God then answers and says, "Yes! If it were possible, you wouldn't need me."

Let's allow God into the equation of how we are going to fit together. Let us allow the forgiveness of Jesus to love us enough to see us past any rough spots and then allow the Holy Spirit to fill in the gaps when we get stuck or are unsure of how to proceed. It can be frustrating looking at all those gray pieces of puzzle, especially when we only find one or two that fit. Just then, God turns them all over and we see that the work we have been doing is part of a greater plan and a more beautiful piece of art than we ever dreamed possible.

I can't tell you how long my tenure as 'coach' will be at Centenary, that's not for me to decide. I believe we need to focus on the part of the Kingdom that God has given us. Let's commit, through prayer, to working together to see what beautiful images we can help God build. *Pastor Mel* (Email: meln@jaxcentenary.org)
