22 At this the man's face fell. He went away sad, because he had great wealth. 23 Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for the rich to enter the kingdom of God!" 24 The disciples were amazed at his words. But Jesus said again, "Children, how hard it is[e] to enter the kingdom of God! 25 It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God."

- Mark 10:22-25 (N.I.V.)

If the passage above sounds familiar, it may be that you heard me preach from it on October 14. I did not preach on giving or tithing that Sunday. The theme for that day was looking at distractions as God led moments in our daily lives. I also mentioned on that Sunday morning that I have preached this passage many times, mostly with the intent of helping us focus on our giving and generosity. That is where I am going with this article. Giving.

On the first three months in November I will be preaching on giving and tithing. These messages will lead us up to the Harvest Dinner on November 18. That is the day we make our pledges to the church. These messages are part of the heritage at Centenary and are guided with the help of the Stewardship Committee. I never want to encourage giving by applying guilt. I never want to encourage giving by snooping around in your personal affairs to how much you can afford to give. I offer Christ.

In the passage above Jesus speaks one of his most iconic messages about money when he talks about a camel going through the eye of a needle. Pretty clear imagery that most can readily understand, if he was truly talking only about money. I tend to believe there is always a little more in Jesus words than what we hear at first listen. What did Jesus mean by rich. We might think financially rich at first thought. Maybe there is more to rich than a bank account.

An individual can be financially poor yet be rich in health, popularity or talent. In C.S. Lewis' book, "Vice and Virtue, A Dictionary of the Good Life," he writes, "Now quite plainly, natural gifts carry with them a similar danger. (Compared to the dangers of money) If you have sound nerves and intelligence and popularity and a good upbringing, you are likely to be quite satisfied with your character as it is. 'Why drag God into it?" you may ask."

Lewis' point is that when we have abundance we tend to look less towards God and treasure only the wonderful gifts we have, whether it's money or something else. In this particular passage Jesus is referring to financial wealth, but I believe Jesus is also saying to all of us in this passage — lay your riches down and follow me.

If we think that this passage is only about money it may lead us to believe we can buy our way into Heaven which would negate everything the Bible teaches us about God's saving grace.





Have you ever seen one of those big cardboard cutouts of thermometers revealing how much money has been donated to a charity? Is that what we envision in Heaven? A big cardboard cutout of a thermometer with our name on it. Do you picture God standing by with a red Sharpie counting the cost of our Discipleship?

The cost of our Discipleship has been paid, at least the entry fee. We can never raise a sufficient amount of funds to make God think we are worthy. Our worth has been revealed through the laying down of the most precious riches God had, His own life.

God did not make this sacrifice to 'guilt' us in to believing, serving and following but to let us know that no other idol will ever suffice. All other riches in this world will eventually let us down, break our hearts and leave us feeling empty.

Jesus did use strong hyperbole when addressing the concerns He has for us. We were never expected to give out of guilt, but out of the same love that God has for us. Just because God is who God is and we are who we are, God loves. The Lord want us to give in response to the love that was shown to us in the cross: genuine, deep, true, never-ending love.

I invite you to be part of this sermon series on giving, tithing and believing in something greater than our own imagination. Shortly after Jesus has this encounter with the rich man on the side of the road, the Lord offers these reassuring words, "With people this is impossible, but with God nothing is impossible." Praise God!





Recipe for November

Sweet & Spicy Grilled Salmon

INGREDIENTS

2 tablespoons hot sauce, such as Frank's

- 1 tablespoon packed dark brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon smoked paprika
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 2 tablespoons light mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon snipped chives
- 8 stalks celery, very thinly sliced

1/2 small red onion, very thinly sliced

Four 5-ounce center-cut skin-on salmon fillets, about 1 inch thick

Salt and freshly ground black pepper Vegetable oil, for oiling the grill

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat an outdoor grill or grill pan on medium.

Mix together the hot sauce, brown sugar, paprika and cayenne in a small bowl. Transfer 1 tablespoon of the mixture to a large bowl and whisk in the mayonnaise; set aside the rest of the sauce. Add the chives, celery and onions to the bowl with the mayonnaise and toss well.

Sprinkle the salmon with salt and pepper. Brush the grill grate lightly with oil. Lay the salmon on the grill, skin-side up, and cook until distinct grill marks appear and the salmon releases easily from the grate, 2 to 3 minutes. Turn and brush the fish with some of the reserved sauce. Continue to cook the fish, brushing the pieces periodically with the sauce, until the salmon fillets are glazed and just cooked through, 13 to 15 minutes more.

Transfer the fillets to individual plates and serve with the celery slaw.
