We are those who have died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? 3 Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? 4 We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

There is something so wonderful about those first few days of Spring-like weather. As I write this, (Tues., Mar. 3 and the temp is close to 60 degrees.) my office window is open. Warm air is blowing in, at least warmer than it has been for a while. It is a day when even a light jacket is not required. One of the benefits of living in this part of the country is the seasonal change. You probably know that I am no fan of winter, except that it helps me appreciate a day like the one I am experiencing right now.

There is something about the cold that makes us appreciate the warmth. The Apostle Paul is relating his theology to us along these same lines. Yes, we find comfort in the darkness, we are even able to navigate through it. Since we know the light will always be there, does it mean we simply remain living in the darkness? Not at all.

The law is good for punishing those who love the dark, yet it fails to help us know the light. Our government tells us the first day of Spring began on March 19; I say it begins the first day I can open my window and not wear my jacket. Even after the first 'official' day of spring there can be winter-like

weather.

New life is much the same way. The law cannot give us an exact day to accept Jesus. We just know it when we know it. A date could be chosen, but our hearts know that the law is insufficient. Our hearts need more than law. Our hearts need a living, breathing God with us to help us appreciate the difference between light and dark.

If we do not know where we are going, it would be good to have an experienced navigator to help show us where to step and where to turn. God knew this so we were given Jesus, and later the Holy Spirit.

I don't know how long this early warm weather will last, I will enjoy it as long as it is here. I will let it serve as a reminder to me that God brought a warm, new life into the world for you and me. How long will it last? If we follow Paul's instruction, then we know that the darkness has been buried, there is no



Pastor Mel recaps information shared at Protocol meeting

Before I share with you the information I received, I need to report that the General Conference that was scheduled for May 5-15, 2020 has been POSTPONED. All dates that were given to me at the briefing at Waverly UMC on Sunday, March 8 may be subject to change with General Conference being postponed. No new dates have been set, I will let you know when dates are confirmed.

As far as what will happen after the General Conference votes, we have been told to be patient. Paul Black, Illinois Great Rivers Conference (IGRC) Director of Communications, gave a very thorough presentation at Waverly UMC. Unfortunately, he could not predict the future of what will happen.

He wanted to make sure that you all know that no vote has been taken nor will any local church have any vote to take until after the General Conference and subsequent Annual Conference decisions are made. No decisions have been made and the Protocol is one of many pieces of legislation to be submitted before the General Conference.

He gave some background information regarding the upcoming conference. There will 862 delegates to the General Conference from all around the world. 56% of those delegates are from the U.S. and the remaining 44% are international delegates. The 862 delegates are split evenly among clergy and lay people. He also said it takes nearly 7,000 volunteers to organize and operate the General Conference. The IGRC will be represented by 10 delegates and 4 non-voting alternates.

The Protocol came out of a meeting of 16 members who came together to discuss a 'Way Forward." They were helped by professional mediator, Ken Feinberg. The members came from all theologies on the subject of homosexuality It was from their discussions that the best possible chance of any legislation passing was to separate. The decision made at the Special 2018 General Conference to leave the language in the Book of Discipline 'as is' did not sit well with many Methodists, especially in the United States.

Some voting irregularities were alleged and the general bad feeling left many from the Special 2018 General Conference wanting to continue looking to a more permanent solution. The more traditionalists (Wesley Covenant Association) decided to leave the denomination for the best of all members. Bishops knew some legislation needed to be presented which could possibly bring this debate to a final conclusion. The result was a 16-member committee, which came up with the

Protocol.

The most probable course is that the Protocol passes and the most conservative faction of the UMC leaves to begin forming a new denomination. The official name of the Protocol is *Reconciliation and Grace through Separation and Restructuring*. The Protocol is a 17,000 word proposal that gives explicit directions to guide the separation of the UMC.

If the UMC votes to divide, those groups that wish to leave will be given until Jan., 2021 to form a new denomination. Annual Conferences will then have the option to remain with the post separation UMC by default. The only way an Annual Conference can do anything other than remain with the existing UMC is if more than 20% of the members present at that Annual Conference vote to bring a formal vote to change. If that occurs, then another Annual Conference will be scheduled and 57% of those attending that meeting will need to vote to disaffiliate.


If any Annual Conference, such as the IGRC, does not vote to change status, they will remain with the post separation UMC. At that time, any local congregation (Centenary, for example) will have the option to remain with their Annual Conference, join one of the new denominations or separate entirely to an independent congregation.

All of these options is why Paul Black recommends that we wait to see how all these parts come into play. Centenary will have plenty of time to make a decision, should that time come. Ultimately, there may be more than two choices of denominations to choose from.

Should the General Conference decide to split, the remaining UMC will initially still be under the 2016 Book of Discipline. They envision the post separation UMC will repeal the Traditional plan and remove the restrictive language regarding LGBTQ persons. However, Black shared that no matter what direction the conference(s) takes, every church and pastor is protected by the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. Pastors have authority over whom they will marry and local churches retain authority over the use of their church buildings.

This is a complex path the UMC is undertaking. Centenary has no decisions to make for a while. This whole process has until the end of 2024 to be completely resolved. More changes may be forthcoming from the General Conference (whenever they are able to safely meet.)

For now, please be patient and listen for updates. I ask you to continue to pray for God's wisdom through this journey.












