aybe I am dating myself, but I recall the old fire alarms which were inside a metal box with a glass cover. They hung on a wall with a small steel bar attached to them by a short link of chain. If you read the words on the glass cover, "break in case of fire." you would know this is where to go for help in case of, well, a fire.

How many people treat God in much the same way. They keep the Lord at arms length, enclosed in a small box, only to be let out in case of a fire, or other disaster that was beyond their own means to solve.

I was watching an old TV show recently where a man was praying to God for help in finding an item he wanted. A moment into the prayer the item is found by another and brought to the praying man. The prayer is abruptly ended with the words, "Thanks God, I got it

now." It was intended to be funny, but it also made a point about how we often look to God only for help in case of a fire.

I think God knew this about us and had Paul write to us about this very thing. Read the end of this passage again, "Pray continually and gives thanks in all circumstances." All the time and continually led me to believe there is no end to the conversation we have with God, it is ongoing, and ongoing and ongoing and well you get the point.

I understand there is a difference, at least for me, between my ongoing conversation with God and my more formal time of prayer. Yet, they feed into one another and create and endless string of connection.

I believe that if we 'continually' work on this endless string we won't need to have those knee jerk moments where our problem suddenly makes God seem relevant.

Don't we need God to be continually relevant in all circumstances?

Our UMW gave a donation to the "Wooden It Be Lovely" project at Douglas Avenue United Methodist Church in Ellen's honor.

Wooden It Be Lovely is a project of Douglas Avenue UMC in Springfield. It offers hope and employment to women healing from lives of poverty, addiction, and abuse; providing transitional employment, mentoring, recovery tools, education, community networking, and a safe community. Women are employed to refurbish and sell donated wooden furniture and sew unique products. This transitional employment empowers women to move towards economic stability and an enhanced wellbeing for themselves and their children.

In lieu of alter flowers on UMW Sunday, Centenary's UMW gave a donation to the Crisis Center Foundation in memory of members who died during 2020 including Martha Simmons, Jan Shelburn, Frances Ballard, Millie Laugharn, Jeannette Hills, and Harriett Pearson.


