



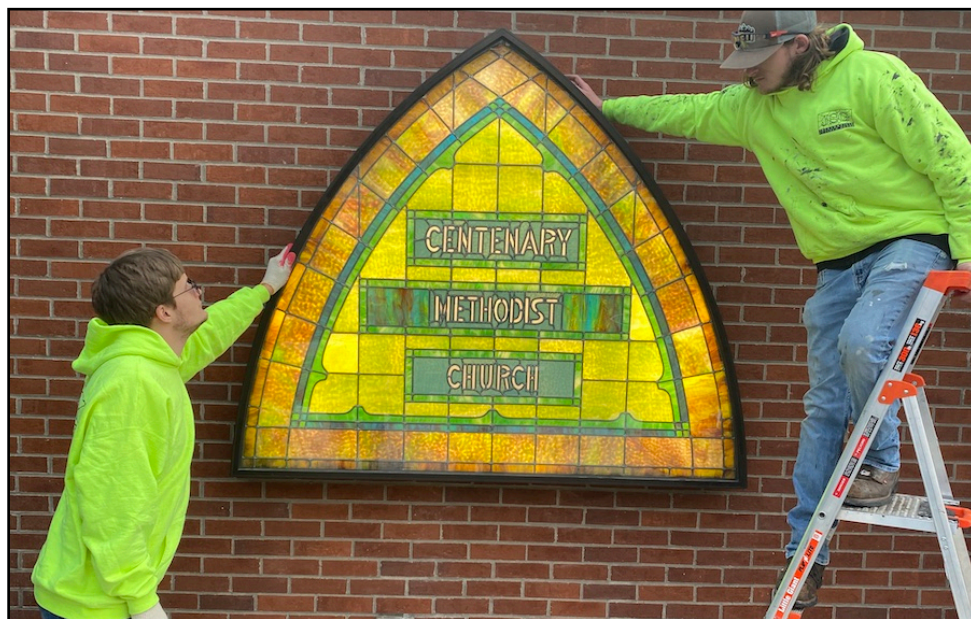

The rest of the offering will go to Jacksonville's "New Directions Warming and Cooling Center". The center which is located at Grace UMC gives their guests a place to stay for evenings, shower, get food, do laundry, and sleep. According to the center's director, Sarah Robinson, families or individuals can stay at the center for up to 60 days while they are working to gain independence.

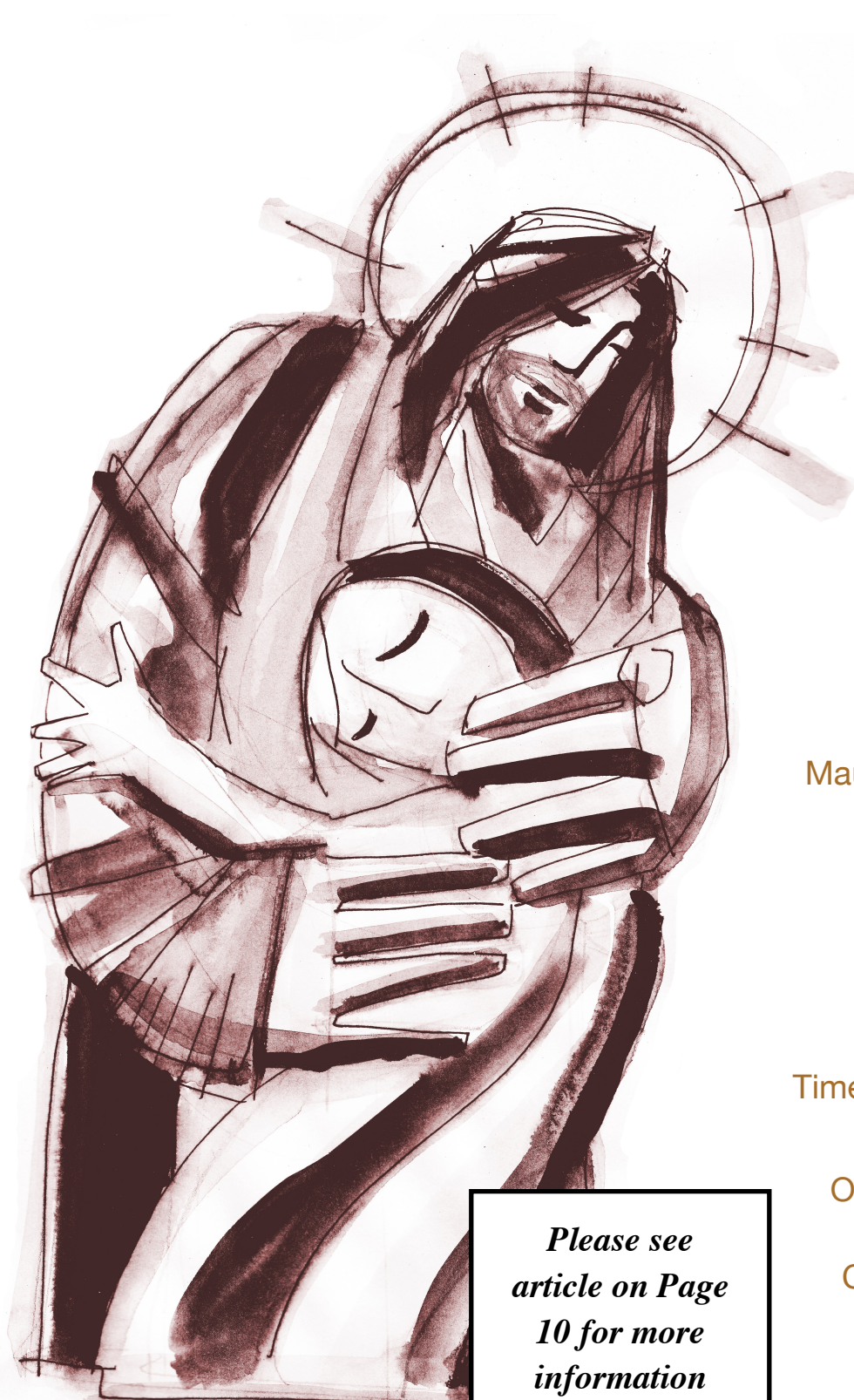

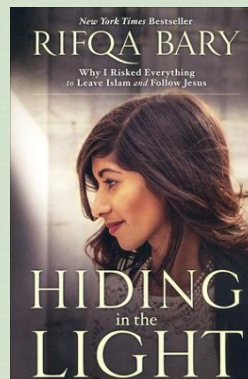


It will soon be time for Doorbell Dinners

I don't think that is possible, however, maybe now is the time to change course. A Visioning Meeting was held on Saturday, February 26 with 27 people in attendance.

The meeting had two sessions, the first began with a review of the last Visioning meeting from 2015. There was supposed to be a review after 5 years, but Covid canceled that meeting. Those in attendance broke in to 5 smaller groups to review the good, bad and other from the 2015 findings.

The second session saw the larger group break up into three smaller groups. They were responsible for thinking about the results from the first session and how we can utilize that information to make a plan for the future. The three groups that met for the
