The images coming out of Ukraine are heartbreaking. Do we still live in this kind of world? Do we still live in a world where an aggressor can take what they want because they have the military might to do so? Apparently! If you would like a Christian perspective on this topic, look to the Sermon on the Mount. Here, you will read Jesus words on bullying, *"You have heard that it was said, 'Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth.' But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also. And if anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, hand over your coat as well."* (Matt. 5:38-40) and later Jesus says, *"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' 44 But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."* (Matt 5:43-44).

To be fair, the Sermon on the Mount were instructions given to Christians who were being persecuted simply because they were Christian. Jesus doesn't say if you are being persecuted for any other reason, go ahead and let

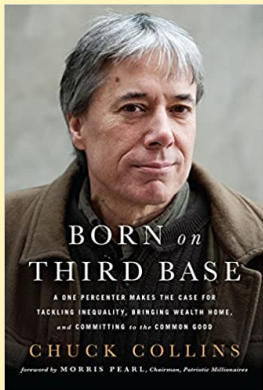

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is accepting donations to help the people of Ukraine. Grants for immediate relief have been given to United Methodist partners in Ukraine as well as neighboring nations—Poland, Hungary, Romania and Slovakia—to support those who remain in Ukraine as well as those who have fled the violence.

In addition, grants are being awarded to partners like ACT Alliance, a global faith-based coalition working in 120 countries around the world. These grants are providing humanitarian assistance in the form of food, water, clothing, shelter and other necessary supplies.

The situation in Eastern Europe is evolving and Global Ministries and UMCOR will continue to respond in the months and years ahead. UMCOR will work with Church World Service to help with refugee needs and resettlement.

them have it. I believe these principals are for any case of abuse or persecution. Jesus wasn't preaching about being weak, the Lord was preaching about being strong.

Maybe you saw the Academy Awards presentation on Sunday, March 27. During the telecast an awards presenter was slapped across the face by an audience member who did not care for a joke told by the presenter.

The one who was slapped was also verbally assaulted by the offended person. The presenter shrugged it all off and simply went on with the show. He has not chosen to press charges or face his abuser in court.

Whether or not Jesus played any part in his decision not to retaliate is unknown. The evidence, however, for Christians, is clear, this is how we respond. We stand there and take it. We move on and we allow the guilt to rest solely on the perpetrator.

Bullying is out of hand and can be described as an epidemic. The government has tried to pass anti-bullying laws, but we all know we can't be forced to like each other. Jesus is not about using force; Jesus is about inviting us to something better.

By standing there and taking it, we deprive the aggressor over what feeds their power. Evil needs engagement, it thrives on our participation. Evil gains more power when we capitulate.

This is why Jesus goes into even greater detail about anger and hatred. *"You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'You shall not murder, and anyone who murders will be subject to judgment.' 22 But I tell you that anyone who is angry with a brother or sister will be subject to judgment."* (Matt. 5:21-22).

Once we make a decision to allow anger to run our lives, we are acting as sinners. We are standing against what Jesus tried to teach us in the Sermon on the Mount. We are not Christians. Easier to say when the attack is a slap on the face. When it is genocide and war crimes and dropping bombs on children's hospitals, Jesus words are far harder to comprehend.

It is often in the darkest moments of our life that make us seek the bright light of God's wisdom.

This is why I fall back onto God's grace to cover me when I fall short of what I am expected to be and to feel.

I have a feeling that if I were a Ukrainian father watching my homeland being turned in to vast cemetery, I would take up arms and push back. I would stand up and say you have taken by shirt but I will not let you have my cloak without a fight.

I would all know that I may be falling short of being a true disciple and all I would have left is God's grace to protect me from myself. If I want God's grace for myself when I stumble, I must also want it for my enemies when they stumble, or there is not hope for humankind.

The hope of all humans resides within the grace of God to forgive us when we do not know what we are doing. Please join with me in praying for God's abundant grace to be felt abundantly.
