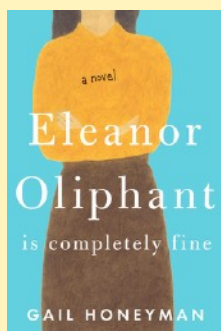

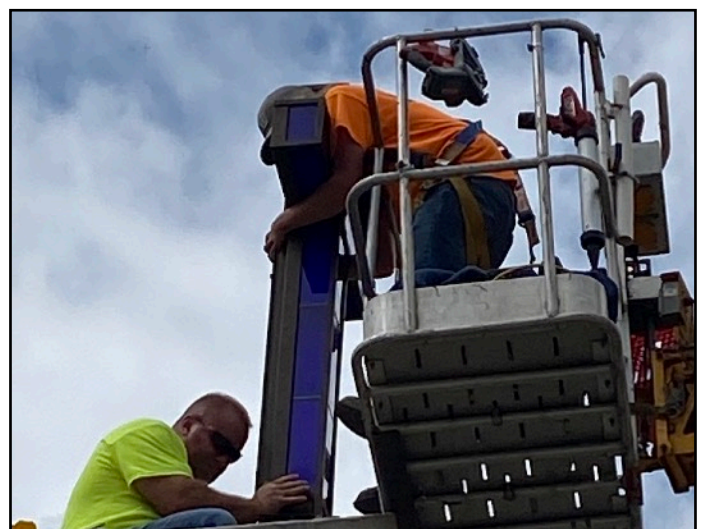
Rice Meals Shipped to Ukraine

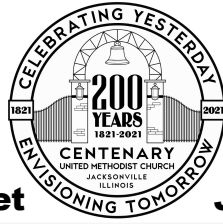
