8 Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble. 9 Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult. On the contrary, repay evil with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing. 10 For, "Whoever would love life and see good days must keep their tongue from evil and their lips from deceitful speech. 11 They must turn from evil and do good; they must seek peace and pursue it. 12 For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous and his ears are attentive to their prayer, but the face of the Lord is against those who do evil." 1 Peter 3:8-12 (N.I.V.)

P aul gets most of the recognition for New Testament writing, but Peter holds his own. In this passage he is encouraging the faithful to not fear but trust in Jesus. Politicians have taught us that the way to be successful is to tear your opponent apart. It isn't just politicians, tearing others apart seems to be the way we are headed as a society.

There are times when certain activities and actions need to be illuminated for the good of the group. When destroying others becomes a spectator sport, it is vile and ugly. For much of history, humans have proven to be proficient at tearing and dividing.

Some parts of worship will seem very familiar, other parts will seem foreign. Not every aspect of in person worship, education and fellowship have been completely resolved. Leadership is still working on bring us back safely. In the meantime, we have a choice to lift each other up in love as we get ever closer to pre-virus days, or we can follow the earthly current trend and tear each other apart.

Inside Church Worship services will return Oct. 4

On Tues., Sept. 15, the Centenary Administrative Council voted to move worship services from the Pavilion to the Sanctuary. Services will be at 8:15 and 10:45.

Pastor Mel will be offering Holy Communion by using pre-packaged elements. Nursery will be provided, but there will be no Sunday School or Children's message. Social distancing will be in place, hand sanitizer will be available. Face masks will be strongly recommended and the church will make them available. There will be no Fellowship Hour in between services.

Please note that ONLY the South doors will be used for entry to the church. Please follow the signs and ushers instructions. Only the Sanctuary and Narthex will be open during worship times. Again this month, the reviews are of books that were not purchased for our church library. They may be at the Jacksonville Library or they may find them for you at another library.

In the area of Spiritual Life, a 2020 selection is <u>Practicing Resurrection: The Gospel of Mark and</u> <u>radical Discipleship</u>, by Janet Wolf. This well-known gospel is presented through voices and experiences that are often relegated to the margins. Where we stand, what we see, whom we listen to or dismiss shape the way we understand the world and the Bible. This study incorporates the stories of those on the margins to uncover how the gospel is alive and well today – how God is, and always has been, calling us to live out the Word in a radical way. (Bonus Book)

Another Spiritual Growth selection is <u>Writings of</u> <u>John Wesley</u>, edited by Keith Beasley-Topliff. The Upper Room Spiritual Classics series is a collection of authoritative text on Christian spirituality by mystics, martyrs and sages curated for the everyday reader. This volume presents excerpts from the hugely influential 18th-century peachier, writer and founder of Methodism. It includes selections from Wesley's journals, sermons and books, offering a clear picture of the spiritual vitality that ignited a movement and continues to transform lives.
