July Lessons

July 2- "At the Center of it All"

Moses goes up Mount Sinai to listen to God and bring back guidelines for living in right relationship with and God and with community.

Bible Verse: "Then God spoke all these words: I am the Lord your God who brought you out of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. You must have no other gods before me." Exodus 20:1-3

July 9 – "The Idols We Keep"

Moses returns to Mount Sinai to find God's people had made an idol.

Bible Verse: "Do not make an idol for yourself – no form whatsoever – of anything in the sky above or on the earth below or in the waters under the earth. Do not bow down to them or worship them. Exodus 20:4-5

July 16- "Respecting God's Name

Jesus calls his followers salt and light during the Sermon on the Mount.

Bible Verse: "Do not use the Lord your God's name as if it were of no significance; the Lord won't forgive anyone who uses his name that way. Exodus 20:7

July 23 – Rediscovering the Power of Sabbath The story of periodic rest for the land and all people.

Bible Verse: "Remember the Sabbath day and treat I as holy. Six days you may work and do all your tasks, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord yours God." Exodus 20: 8-10

July 30 – This is a 5TH Sunday on which we have a service project. One of the services the children provide to Centenary UMC, is as acolytes a Sunday worship. On July 30, we are taking the opportunity to provide training to our acolytes. For those who have been acolytes, it will be a refresher course in the symbolism of the activity and the proper way to perform it. We have some new Kindergarteners who will be in training for the first time. They are very excited to be a part of this important part of ours community's worship.

UWF Reading Program

For 2023, books from 2018-2023 reading program lists are eligible for reporting credit, if you have not previously read them.

A reminder! There are many books suitable for children and youth as part of the UWF Reading Program. You may get credit for them also. And the big plus is that you can share them with yours children and grandchildren.

You can also receive Reading Program credit for listening to the Faith Talks podcasts. Listening to at least two episodes of Faith Talks counts as the equivalent of one book. You can find the podcasts on the UWF website. This might be a good program at a circle meeting! You can listen together and discuss.

Another way to receive book credit is by watching movies of Reading Program books. Three of those available are Hidden Figures, Pushout, and The Hate U Give. In determining the category for credit, identify the category of the original book and apply credit for the film to the same category. This is also a good possibility for a circle program.

A children's book, written by Rachel Held Evans, entitled What Is God Like? Is under the category of Spiritual Growth. This Picture book by the late Rachel Evans and her friend, Matthew Paul Turner, answers what is for many children their first question about God: What is God like?

Through pictures from the Bible, children see God is like a shepherd, like a star, like a gardener,

For more than three decades, African American missionary Susan Angeline Collins made a tremendous difference in the lives of countless African women and children, some orphaned and homeless and others escaping early marriage and subservience. Authored by retired professor Janis Bennington Van Buren, this book explores the remarkable service-oriented life of Collins from her 1851 birth in Illinois until her 1940 death in Iowa. Collins overcame economic, education, gender, race religious and other obstacles surrounding

race, religious, and other obstacles surrounding Africa's colonization to serve as a stalwart missionary, leader, teacher, nurse, construction manager, and surrogate mother to "her girls".


